A Little More Detail

- * Prevalence
 - > 2003 data
 - > 1.7 per 10,000 births
- Speech and language Issues
 - > 96% of people with VCFS are language delayed
 - Pharyngoplasty vs. pharyngel flap
- From a Parent's Perspective: Coordinating Your Child's Care
 - Be proactive "you are the professional parent"

- Psychiatry, Behavior and Neuroscience
 - > Schizophrenia is prevalent in this population (23% of VCFS population vs. 1.3% of general population)
 Canadian study
 - > social and attention problems are prevalent
 - withdrawal
 - complaints stomach aches, headaches
 - > seek mental health advice early

A Little More Detail (continued)

Cognitive and behavioral

- > 30% of VCFS population are ADHD
- children tend to become more withdrawn and internalized with age

* Autism spectrum

- ▶ 14% in VCFS population vs. .2% in general population
- lower than first expected however

Psychiatric disturbance in adults with VCFS

- develop in late teens or older
- Bipolarism not showing up at higher rates
- Figure 1 Tonized calcium levels are a clue
- Manage your child's stress levels to delay or reduce the on set of psychiatric issues
