## Cl ub Gossip <br> Zephyrs in Big Night Out at Ashburton

On Friday 9th May Ashburton`s new $\$ 7.2$ million Events Centre was officially opened by the Prime Minister Ms Helen Clarke. This was the accumulation of several years of fund raising and some rather large donations from members of the Ashburton community. Mr Peter Gluyas was given the job of arranging transport for the 40 members of the official party at the Fire Station to the foyer of the new Events Centre.

He told me he first thought of using new Ford series cars, but after having been involved with the Zephyr Club during our Connection in Ashburton thought why not use older Fords. He himself owns several Ford models from years gone by. So he approached myself with the MKII, Ross Todd with the MKIII, and Jeff Taylor with the MKIV.

Thinking that maybe Helen Clarke might want to ride in a Zephyr my cleaner and polisher set to work several days before and cleaned the car inside and out. I would have to say that the chrome was the shiniest it's possibly ever been. Anyway Friday the 9th May started fine enough but by lunch-time light rain had set in, so much for the polishing.

The instructions were that all drivers had to be tidily dressed, as it was a black tie affair we had to be down there by 5.00 p .m. so we knocked off a bit earlier and got cleaned up. Her indoors who has more wardrobe sense than me decided that my trousers didn't match my shoes, so a change it was. Anyway we got to the Fire Station on time, but my biggest fear was, that with someone important in the back and raining, the MKIIs vaccum wipers might not be quite adequate.
