When we got it home after playing truckie for 2 days, it was time to sort out what we actually had and plan to get it all back together.

The first thing was to get it painted ...what colour?? We were driving thru' ChCh and spotted a Honda that we liked the colour of. We followed him and when he stopped we asked him if he knew the actual colour of his car. It turned out that he worked for Honda in ChCh and not only knew the colour...Rose Metallic", but was able to give us the paint numbers etc.... sorted!!!
