We bought our first white MkIV, 1966 2.5 litre, in 1971 from Hutchinson Motors in Christchurch. I was a one owner with 40,000 miles on the clock. We travelled all over the South Island in that car with very few problems, before selling it in 1980 when we went to the UK, it had then done 105,000 miles.

Returning from the UK 2 years later we saw our old MkIV in Mike Darren Motors, with an asking price double what we got for it two years earlier. It had done 50,000 miles and had five owners in that time, and whilst it was still running well it had had a hard life so we passed on it and bought a Hillman Hunter - yeh, great car.

After putting up with it for some months we spotted a white 1966 MkIV in Errol James car yard that was almost identical to the one we'd sold before leaving. One owner, 62,000 miles for which we gave the Hunter and \$250 and it was ours.



We used it as our only car for about 5 years before buying a Mk IV Cortina. We were offered \$400 for the Zephyr as a trade-in, but decided to keep it and parked it up in Alice's father's garage for a number of years, starting it occasionally and taking it for a drive around the block.

When the SCZZEC held a Southern Connection here sometime in the 90s, we were asked to bring the MkIV down to the display as I think there were none in the club at that time, after which we joined.

In the 24 years we've owned the MkIV we have not really done a lot to it. The rear calipers were overhauled, and most of the exhaust system was replaced, and more recently new carpet fitted as the original had worn through in places. The rest of the interior is all original and unmarked, including the dash top



About 4 years ago the clutch started slipping. We had a reconditioned motor with a good clutch sitting in the garage (as you do) so figured we may as well just swap the motors, which would only take a weekend. But when the motor was out it was decided that it would be a good opportunity to clean up the engine bay, so everything was pulled out and the engine bay was blasted and repainted with Gavin's help.



After a couple of months everything was completed and the car was back on the road.

The new motor turned it into a totally different car and it now runs effortlessly, and with a bit of luck will do us for another 24 years.
