John & Glenis purchased the MkIII Zephyr Special in October 1976 from Warren Price Motors, the local Fiat Agent. John was working there as a mechanic. Another current Zephyr club member, Neville Jarvis, traded the Zephyr on a Falcon.

John reconditioned the motor and gearbox and the Zephyr was used as the main family car for ten years, transporting kids to sport and school. It was also used for family outings and holidays towing the 'Zephyr' caravan.

John served his apprenticeship at Timaru Motors Ford, working there for seven years, and until this day he has a keen interest in all Fords (including Toyota).

The MkIII was in a very tidy, pretty much original condition when purchased and still is today.

The Zephyr Special was introduced into New Zealand by the Ford Motor Company as a fleet vehicle for stock agents etc and has remained as the rarest model Zephyr ever made.
