Taylor ES Student Council Election Procedures:

- 1. Teachers in 4th & 5th grades inform students about the student council room representative position. Any questions about the council can be directed to one of the faculty advisors: Albert Gresens, Cindella Attucks, or Jeff Trebich.
- 2. Students that are interested in being a room representative can prepare an election speech to be read to their classmates. After all students have shared their speeches, a classroom election is to be held.
- 3. The student that receives the most votes is to be considered the room representative. The student that receives the second most votes is to be considered the alternate.
- 4. After all classroom elections are completed, the student council will assemble for its first meeting. At this time council members will be informed of their responsibilities and duties as a council member.
- 5. Also, at the first meeting, council members will be informed about the descriptions and responsibilities of the positions of student council officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and historian). At this time students may decide to run for an officer's position.
- 6. Once the officers are elected, they will meet with the faculty advisors to confirm the schedule and set up potential committees, and organize duties and responsibilities.
