<b>Pope</b>	The supreme head of the Catholic Church and the bishop of Rome.	
<b>Priest</b>	A clergy member or minister of a Christian church. A clergy member able to administer the sacraments.	
<b>Parish</b>	A district (area) that has its own church and clergyman (priest).	
<b>Sacraments</b>	Solemn religious ceremonies of the Christian Church. In Catholicism, there are seven sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Confession, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders, and Matrimony.	
<b>Monastery</b>	A place where monks (and sometimes nuns, though these are usually called convents) live by themselves in a contemplative (thinking) life according to fixed rules and under religious vows.	
<b>Heretic</b>	A person who holds a belief that is against the accepted beliefs of his church.	
<b>Excommunication</b>	The act of cutting a person off from membership into a church and from any part in its ceremonies or association with any other members of that church.	
<b>Crusades</b>	Christian military wars between the years 1096-1272 to take over the Holy Land (Jerusalem and other parts of the Middle East) from Muslims.
