CENTRO EDUCATIVO 'BLAS PASCAL' Projects... A New Style of Teaching, A New Style of Learning

Underlying our entire academic program is a teaching philosophy known as "constructivism". Basically, this philosophy attempts to help students "learn to learn" rather than the customary cycle of



lecture, memorize, reproduce and forget. An important part of this plan is the use of different teaching strategies and means of evaluation (testing). Many of our classes now incorporate a more "active" approach to learning that often involves projects. To date we've seen our students create large scale ramps and levers, scales, working microscopes, models of cells and wall size relief maps. At times it's messy, noisy and apparently chaotic, but it's been fun to watch our students enjoy learning.

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? Thinking Maps

Last spring Bryce had the opportunity to meet Leslie Fortier, an English teacher at Jones Community College in Laurel, MS. and a member of Woodland Presbyterian Church in Hattiesburg, MS. We had been looking for an experienced teacher to help us develop a program and train our English teachers to teach English as a Second Language (ESL). After hearing Bryce speak about this need at Woodland, Les contacted us. While visiting with Les, she showed Bryce a teaching technique called "Thinking Maps" she had been using with her remedial English students at JCC. Bryce contacted Lupita (Headmaster of CEBP) to tell her about the Maps and we decided to invite Les to come to Mérida to do a workshop with our

faculty. During the summer, Les came down with a work team from her church and presented the Maps to a couple of our teachers. The next step was having her return Thanksgiving week to do a workshop with the entire faculty. Everyone is excited! The faculty will be implementing the Maps in January, Les has plans to come back in March and May with the possibility of a longer term (1-2 year) stay to supervise the use of the Maps and also to reinforce our English program. We are grateful to Woodland Pres. Church for providing the funds needed for Les to make these trips and for the purchase of the Thinking Map manuals for our staff.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

We have been excited to see the many ways the Lord has provided for the financial needs of our SERFAM Projects. During the 2002-03 school year approximately 70% of our total budget was met locally through tuitions and special fund-raising projects. This year we hoped to see this increase to 75-80% but we weren't able to foresee some of the additional expenses we would incur upon adding the 12th Grade at CEBP. From our perspective, this appears to be our "make it or break it" year, financially speaking. Although we will still be close to 70% from local funding, we still need to raise an additional \$24,000.00 to meet our budget through the end of this school year.
