What is a Body Scrub?

What is a body scrub? A body scrub is a mixture of exfoliates and beneficial natural oils. Dead Sea Salts, Sea Salts, Fine Salts, Sugar, Ground Oatmeal or Coffee is commonly used as exfoliates. Typically the oils used are Sweet Almond Oil, Grape seed Oil, Apricot Kernel Oil, Cotton Seed Oil, Avocado Oil, just to name a few. The combination of the exfoliates and the oils provides a product that will help slough away dead skin cells, keeping skin new and fresh while the oils will moisturize the skin.

How is a scrub used?

Body Scrubs are to be used in the bath or shower. Simply scoop some of the scrub out of the container, and rub onto skin using your hands or a loofah sponge. The most common areas you would use a scrub on are your legs and arms. Sometimes a scrub can be used on the face as well (if done sparingly). After scrubbing, simply rinse the product away- your skin will be super soft due to the oils. **Please use caution when using the product as the oils can cause the tub to be slippery.

Currently Marlo Quinn offers five types of scrubs:

- 1. Java Scrub (coffee, sugar & salt)- Comes naturally scented
- 2. Turbinado (Sugar)- Customer may choose scent
- 3. Marlo by the Sea (Dead Sea Salts, Desert Salts & Sea Kelp)- Naturally Scented
- 4. Honey Bath Body Polish (Honey, Maple Syrup, Fine Dead Sea Salts & Sugar)- Naturally Scented
- 5. Marlo Body Butter Scrub (not oil based like the others, this is actually a whipped body butter that has exfoliates mixed into the crème base). Customer may choose scent

All of the scrubs currently offered by Marlo Quinn are 100% Natural (with the exception of the fragrance chosen by customer). A natural preservative of Tocopherol (Vitamin E) and other essential oils is used. If you have ordered a scrub you will notice that when you open the container, it will typically look like a half inch of oil covering the granules, this is completely normal!

The only time this will not be the case is with the Honey Bath Body Polish as well as the Body Butter Scrub, as these do not primarily oil based.

**Smells like coffee, must be a coffee lover to truly enjoy this scrub! The coffee used in this scrub is organic. Coffee is supposed to help with improving damage done to skin by free radicals, also know to help with cellulite.

Information on the EGCG in Coffee:

ECGC is as much as 100 times more powerful an antioxidant as vitamin C, and 25 times more powerful than vitamin E. ECGC also may account for the antibacterial properties of green tea.

- **This one is one of my personal favorites- here is an interesting article about the benefits of Dead Sea Salts-
- -The waters of the Dead Sea have been renowned for their therapeutic effects for over 2,000 years. Bathing in high quality sea salt could replenish the minerals which are critical our skin metabolism.
- -The waters from the Dead Sea are unique they contain 27% of various salts as compared to 3% in normal sea water. The balances of the salts in Dead Sea water are: magnesium, potassium, calcium chloride and bromides. Magnesium is important in combating stress and fluid retention, slowing skin aging and calming the nervous system. Calcium is effective at preventing water retention, increasing circulation and strengthening bones and nails. Potassium energizes the body, helps to balance skin moisture and is a crucial mineral to replenish following intense exercise. Bromides act to ease muscle stiffness and relax muscles. Sodium is important for the lymphatic fluid balance (which in turn is important for immune system function).

Studies have been conducted on the health benefits of bathing in Dead Sea salts. One such study was conducted by Dr. I. Machtey 1 on 103 patients suffering from osteoarthritis and tendinitis. Patients were either treated with baths of 7.5%, 2% or 0.5% Dead Sea salt concentration. Improvement was found after as little as 1 week of treatment for those treated with 7.5% or 2% salt baths. By the study's end, 80% of the patients reported less pain; 70% experienced improved mobility and 60% were able to decrease their use of analgesics. Dr. J. Arndt 2 studied the effect of Dead Sea salt baths on psoriasis. Fifty patients were treated for 3 - 4 weeks, with 3 - 4 baths per week. In as little as 1 week, many patients treated with a 10% salt concentration in their baths experienced marked improvement. This improvement included relief from itching, sleep disturbances, and skin scaling. Treatment with Dead Sea Salts is not associated with any side effects.

Perfect for manicures, before paraffin dips & pedicures. We do recommend using a clean scoop to remove your scrub to prevent excess water from entering the container.
