

In addition to accomplishing our short-term goals of continuing the Food Pantry projects and beginning several other projects, the Nehemiah Project is beginning support for missions projects in the City.

Our Food Pantries at Grace and Shepherd of the Hills are doing well and exceeding our targets for families served. We could use additional volunteers for these pantries.

Tina Haner of Zion Lutheran continues to head up our newest project – touching the lives of homeless people through the distribution of personal care items. By now, all congregations should have a collection center for such items as tooth paste, tooth brushes, shaving items, etc. We will provide them to places where homeless people are best served, such as at St. Anthony's. We will also carry out our Fall projects again this year of collecting coats, blankets, and toys for distribution to those in need. Start pulling out your old coats (ideally reasonably clean) and bring them to your congregations in September. We will collect blankets in October, and toys for Christmas in November into December.

We will be organizing for Youth Servant Events in San Francisco over this year. Rather than inviting Lutheran youth from around the nation to visit us in San Francisco and help us with service projects for our churches and the community, we will carry out a couple of local youth events this year in practice for a synod event in 2006. It will take careful planning to find the resources to support these young people and provide supervision and opportunities for Christian learning and fellowship, so again, we need your help.

SECOND FOOD PANTRY AT GRACE LUTHERAN IS AN IMMEDIATE SUCCESS

By the second distribution Saturday on 3 July, the new Food Pantry at Grace Lutheran Church exceeded our hopes for 50 families, and has been serving over 70 families every Saturday morning since then. We started our second Food Pantry distribution center at Grace Lutheran Church after a dedication service led by Pastor Ruclare Pauling on Thursday 24 June. Pastor Pauling became the patron saint of the Food Pantry projects by encouraging us to begin these projects and then to treat our clients with dignity. Many Nehemiah Project volunteers have contributed to the success of this new Food Pantry, especially Charlotte Elliott, our Coordinator for the Grace Food Pantry, and Mildred Furness and Thelma Elliott and others who do the shopping every week at the S.F. Food Bank and accept delivery on Fridays.

Meanwhile, our first Food Pantry at Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran continues to serve an average of 50 families each Saturday morning. We took our experienced teams at SOTH and split a portion of each team to Grace, so we started out at Grace with team members with the experience to get us off to a good start there and teach new team members. As at SOTH, we have four teams – one for each Saturday of the month so that each volunteer gets an opportunity to serve at a pantry once each month (unless volunteers would like to serve more often, whereupon we would love to assign you to more than one team).


DO YOU LIKE TO SHOP? DO YOU LIKE TO SET UP NEW THINGS?

We need more volunteers to fill out our teams at both Grace and the first pantry at Shepherd of the Hills (SOTH) Lutheran Church.

We particularly need volunteers for our Friday Delivery Acceptance teams at both Grace and SOTH. These teams wait for the Food Bank delivery truck between 1:00 and 3:00 p.m. on Friday afternoon, unload the pallets of food when they arrive, and stock the food and produce to the tables in the distribution room so it is all ready for our distribution on Saturday. Our weekly shoppers also need help to move the carts around with food once a week at the S.F. Food Bank – so if you like shopping and have a couple of hours on Wednesday or Thursday morning, please let us know.

And the shopping does cost the Nehemiah Project money each week. The San Francisco Food Bank gives us plenty of free fresh produce every week, but they sell us the food at \$.18 per pound of dry food (cans, cereal boxes, whatever) and \$.04 per pound for bread. Thus the Nehemiah Project spends about \$80 to \$90 of food per week for each pantry. So if you want to make a special offering to the Nehemiah project to help us buy food, we would appreciate that very much.

Zion Gains Approval for Facility Expansion

On Thursday, July 15, Zion's petition for a conditional use permit was heard by the City Planning Commission and was approved. This opens the door for Zion to proceed with its facility expansion plans. Only modest conditions were placed upon the approval, such as the submission of a traffic plan for the discharge and pickup of school children.

Zion is planning a 16,500 sq. ft. educational facility to compliment its current education wing. It will be located on Ninth Ave., immediately to the north of the present education wing. It will be a separate building, but will be connected to the wing. It will be three stories, including a basement and a roof playground. Access to the playground/ parking lot will then be from 10^{th} Ave. rather than the current access from 9^{th} Ave. There will be neither gain nor loss of parking.

The new building will allow Zion to move its Junior High Department out of its temporary quarters in a remodeled house on 10th Ave. It will also enable the school to relocate its 2nd and 3rd grades to the ground floor, close to the present Kindergarten and 1st grade. The top floor will add considerable fellowship space for congregational activities, provide an elevator access to the gym for larger congregational activities, as well as a teachers' lounge and prep area. The basement will add a youth room, a nursery for congregational activities, and space for the extended care program of the school.

Some remodeling to the existing facilities will also be incorporated, enlarging and making more welcoming the entrance on Ninth Ave., enlarging and making more efficient the school office, creating a new church office and adding ministerial staff offices as Zion's programs expand. Zion will also convert the Junior High building into a pair of flat, replacing the flats Zion will tear down for its new building. The old teacherage will have a second floor added and be turned into a pair of flats as well. These will serve as housing for ministerial staff.

The next few months will involve a lot of engineering and detailed drawings, securing the contractor, and arranging the financing. Zion has raised nearly \$750,000 in new money toward this new project. The estimated cost will be around \$2.3 million.

Zion thus will join Hope Lutheran and West Portal Lutheran who have expanded their facilities to expand or improve their day school ministries, Holy Spirit who relocated their facilities, and Bethel/Grace who will be opening soon a new preschool. Lots of signs of hope among these congregations about the future of their ministries.

Zion's Day School Opens

Zion's Day School opened its 59th school year on Monday, August 23. It hosts a special celebration for the families and children with a "Back to School Bar-B-Q" on Sunday, September 12, after the late service.

Zion welcomes two new teachers this year. Ms. Jennifer Louie will teach 5th grade. Jennifer has her master's degree in education from the University of the Pacific, and is an alumna of Zion Day School. Mr. Mark Lindow will teach 6th grade, and received his teaching credential from San Francisco State University. Mark is the husband of Shelly Lindow, who is Zion's Children and Youth Minister. He will also soon be a proud father.

The enrollment this year appears to be about 192 students, slightly ahead of last year—but there is still room for growth. The Principal is Ms. Carolyn Grundt.

Zion Observes a Monthly Health Ministry Sunday

Zion observes every fourth Sunday as Health Ministry Sunday. The Board for Health and Human Care Ministry provides blood pressure screening during the coffee hour and makes available a newsletter filled with health information on that day. An opportunity is also given for people to come to the altar at the conclusion of the service for special prayers, laying on of hands, and anointing with oil. This gives the Pastor and other health ministers an opportunity to minister to those who seek wholeness of body, mind and spirit in the name of Jesus. This ministry is open to all.
