

The new Food Pantry at Grace Lutheran Church has now been serving over 100 families every Saturday morning, and the original food pantry at Shepherd of the Hills distributeS food to 45 to 50 families at the same time each week. While we cannot ask client families to attend worship services as a condition for food distribution, and we cannot use overt evangelism programs, we can talk with our clients and let them know how Christ is the center and support of our own lives. Most of the families served at Grace are Cantonese-speaking. While we have had a good core of volunteers for both Saturday distributions, **we need Cantonese-speaking volunteers** at the Grace Food Pantry to assist these client families with food selections and to answer their questions about how we can help their families in many other ways.

WE NEED HELP ON FRIDAY AFTERNOONS AT OUR FOOD PANTRIES – CAN YOU LIFT A BAG OF POTATOES?

We particularly need volunteers for our Friday Delivery Acceptance teams at both Grace and SOTH. These teams wait for the Food Bank delivery truck between noontime and 3:00 p.m. on Friday afternoon, unload the pallets of food when they arrive, and stock the food and produce to the tables in the distribution room so it is all ready for our distribution on Saturday. Our weekly shoppers also need help to move the carts around with food once a week at the S.F. Food Bank – so if you like shopping and have a couple of hours on Wednesday or Thursday morning, please let us know.

And the shopping does cost the Nehemiah Project money each week. The San Francisco Food Bank gives us plenty of free fresh produce every week, but they sell us the food at \$.18 per pound of dry food (cans, cereal boxes, whatever) and \$.04 per pound for bread. Thus the Nehemiah Project spends about \$80 to \$90 of food per week for each pantry. So if you want to make a special offering to the Nehemiah project to help us buy food, we would appreciate that very much. PAGE 2

The Nehemiah Project continues its ongoing social services projects to collect coats and blankets for distribution to those in need. Tina Haner of Zion Lutheran continues to head up our project touching the lives of homeless people through the distribution of personal care items. By now, all congregations should have a collection center for such items as tooth paste, tooth brushes, shaving items, etc.

And our two food pantries continue each Saturday to serve our neighborhoods.

The Nehemiah Project is now considering social services projects that directly provide evangelism opportunities. Let your congregational Nehemiah Project representatives know if you have spiritual gifts that will enable the Nehemiah Project to begin new projects, such as

- 1 "Conversation Partners" to help non-native English speakers to help practice their English language skills (and make new friends at the same time, with the possibility of bringing them to Christ through your conversations)
- l Computer training classes
- l Music classes

And we continue to have a goal to begin prayer groups or small-group ministries in the Financial District of San Francisco.

The Place To Be

It has really been exciting to be a part of the development of this new ministry. The worship services are very uplifting. Pastor's sermons and the music have built a Gospel and joy filled celebration of Christ. The attendance at our services is beginning to grow and more people are coming early for worship to join in the pre-service praise music. Since joining together last August we have received five new members.

The music program consists of organ and piano, the Praise Band, and choir. We have had special flute pieces, singing duets and a full praise service, combined cantata with West Portal and a musical Sunday School Christmas program.

We continue to develop the programs and the mission part of our new venture. Last Sunday, we were blessed to welcome DCE Karen Jacob, she will be working part-time developing a ministry to the community children and doing some administrative assistant duties. Her first project is developing a neighborhood Easter Saturday event. We will be inviting the 500 children that attended our Halloween event and the 50 who attended our VBS. Karen will also help us develop a Summer Day Camp program and hopefully a youth ministry.

Carolyn Wilson-Koerschen has been contracted as a project manager for our pre-school. Since so much time has elapsed since we had the Genesis Study, she is again reviewing the demographic data to be sure a preschool is viable in the Grace area. If it is we are still praying for a September opening. There is a lot of intense work that must be done to achieve this time goal.

The food box continues at Grace, 80–100 families are served each week. This is also being looked at for the Bethel location. Before we do that we need volunteers to run it. We are hoping to develop some type of small group ministry or fellowship ministry.

One interesting mission idea is *conversation partners.* Since many of the members are fluent/ native English speaking we can match up volunteers with those people who want to practice and improve their English speaking ability. It does not require any special skill or advance training, does not require cost for materials, and allows for meaningful relationships to develop. This program is being considered for both the Bethel and Grace locations.

Other programs we are looking at are computer classes, music academy and Chinese small groups.

Once a month, on the first Saturday, we have started prayer meetings. With all the plans, goals and programs this is a vital part of our lives and though prayer is not limited to once a month, this is a special time to gather together for prayer.

On Saturday, December 4th, the Rev. Praise Band and Basketball Small Groups
