SHOULD WE START A THIRD FOOD PANTRY?

The new Food Pantry at Grace Lutheran Church has now been serving over **150** families every Saturday morning, and the original food pantry at Shepherd of the Hills distributes food to 50 to 60 families at the same time each week. The San Francisco Food Bank is impressed by our performance and the spirit of our volunteers, so they are asking the Nehemiah Project to consider starting a third food pantry.

We can do so with additional volunteers – Let us know if you want to help start a new pantry – if we receive a good response from our congregational members, we will jump into it.

WE NEED HELP ON FRIDAY AFTERNOONS AT OUR FOOD PANTRIES – CAN YOU LIFT A BAG OF POTATOES?

We particularly need volunteers for our Friday Delivery Acceptance teams at both Grace and SOTH. These teams wait for the Food Bank delivery truck between noontime and 3:00 p.m. on Friday afternoon, unload the pallets of food when they arrive, and stock the food and produce to the tables in the distribution room so it is all ready for our distribution on Saturday. Our weekly shoppers also need help to move the carts around with food once a week at the S.F. Food Bank – so if you like shopping and have a couple of hours on Wednesday or Thursday morning, please let us know.

And the shopping does cost the Nehemiah Project money each week. The San Francisco Food Bank gives us plenty of free fresh produce every week, but they sell us the food at \$.18 per pound of dry food (cans, cereal boxes, whatever) and \$.04 per pound for bread. Thus the Nehemiah Project spends about \$80 to \$90 of food per week for each pantry. **So if you want to make a special offering to the Nehemiah project to help us buy food, we would appreciate that very much.**

Mel certainly has a heart for social ministry and for sharing the Gospel message with folks who have not yet heard it. He is a quiet person but a person with a strong faith who has served well in many capacities.

He was instrumental in the formation of the Nehemiah Project where he has always been a very active participant. He currently serves as the president. He spearheaded the formation of the Food Pantries at Shepherd of the Hills and Grace Lutheran Churches, and continues to work with this efficiently run program,.

He was very much involved in the discussions which led to the formation of Bethel and Grace ministries. He served as the secretary when the initial group of representatives had their meetings. The packet of information that he wrote for the members of Shepherd of the Hills to consider, was certainly well written, expressing the need for evangelism ministry by congregations working together to do so.

Mel has filled several offices on the council of Shepherd of the Hills. He is currently serving his second term as president. He also regularly attends Bible Class and Worship each Sunday. He shares his faith through Bible Class discussions, often reminding us of the need for sharing the gospel with folks who have not yet heard it. He usually leads the class in the closing prayer, summarizing the focus of the lesson in doing so. Before Worship Service begins, he is distributing bulletins and welcoming all who come to worship. He assists in the Worship Service as needed, often helping Pastor Fox with the distribution of communion. He is also a member of the choir (The Shepherd Singers) adding his voice to the others in giving praise to God. He is a very important member of the congregation and will certainly be missed.

More could be said about Mel and his ministry among us, his leadership abilities, as well as his commitment to serving others and to sharing the Gospel message in various ways. But for now we just say THANK YOU VERY MUCH, MEL, for being the person that you are, for continuing to grow in your faith as a Christian, and for being an example to others in various ways. Thank you very, very much. May God be with you and continue to guide you in your new venture. We will keep you in our prayers. We will miss you, and we will look forward to your return to ministry here in San Francisco. God bless you always.

TOWARD A SAN FRANCISCO LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL

"The longest journey begins with the first step." It has been a dream of many of you that a Lutheran High School of excellent quality education and spiritual and moral strength be started and grown. If that is your hope, also, please bring this to the Lord God in prayer. If God so wills, and if we roll up our sleeves in helpful service, it can and will happen. But first, a little recent history.

In November 2004, over 40 people were present for an initial gathering of interest in the possibility of starting a San Francisco Lutheran High School. Since then, various volunteers have come together to vision and work toward this goal. With the help of a \$500 grant from the English District LC-MS, application was made to undertake a Synodical Genesis Project feasibility study. The application was approved. Step #1!

We are happy to announce to you that the retired top man in the LC-MS School Ministry, Dr. Carl Moser, was appointed and has accepted to lead this year-18 month feasibility study. I have been in touch with Dr. Moser and he has accepted our invitation to come to San Francisco for an initial consultation on Friday and Saturday, June 3rd and 4th. He looks forward to working with our Exploratory Task Force, and representatives from Hope, Zion, and West Portal Lutheran Schools, as well as people from the greater San Francisco community. Dr. Moser grew up in Portland, Oregon, and is familiar with life on the West Coast.

How can you help?

- 1) First, of course, with your prayers Pray for our 9-member and growing exploratory task force that God would send them a spirit of vision and leadership.
- 2) Secondly, at our May 5th Circuit-wide Ascension Service reception, we saw a short Power Point presentation by West Portal Lutheran member and USCF research physician, Dr. Robert Bok, on some Lutheran High Schools across the USA. We will try to make a viewing of this possible at our churches, schools, pastoral conferences, LWML zone rallies, and other meetings.
- 3) Pray for and help strengthen our San Francisco area pre-school/child care schools, elementary, and middle schools. While a Lutheran High School will help strengthen Christian outreach and our current schools, it will also offer San Francisco a quality Lutheran High School that reaches the needs of many youth and families—educationally, musically, aesthetically, athletically, and especially spiritually.
- 4) Make a financial gift, which can be made out to the SF Lutheran Nehemiah Project and earmarked for the Genesis Project feasibility study and a San Francisco Lutheran High School. SFLNP is now a non-profit organization that can "umbrella" the SF Lutheran High School effort.
- 5) Dr. Moser will be interviewing 40-50 or more people who have an interest in a SF Lutheran High School. If you wish to be interviewed, call West Portal Lutheran Church and leave a brief message for Pastor Stechholz, 415-661-0242, ext. 22.

Our pastor could give the homily during the night [praise worship] and we could bring more people to Christ. The size of our group has grown to the point where I feel we can form two bands. Our openness encourages people to want to join and it seems like it's time to start teaching again for those who are interested. None of this would be possible without God. It is miraculous that our band has grown and matured at such a fast rate and we hope to be a beacon of light that will shine bright with God's love.

The "Cinco de Mayo" reception and fellowship time after the Service was sponsored by leaders of the San Francisco Lutheran Nehemiah Project, with great refreshments and interesting displays featuring the work of the Nehemiah Project's food pantries, the Bethel Center, two Youth Servant Events planned for this summer, and a presentation regarding the possibility of a San Francisco Lutheran High School. The service was attended by 226 members of the various SF/Daly City congregations. Let's do it again next year—either at West Portal or another of our sister congregations!

May is also the month for youth Confirmations with 20 young people being confirmed on Sunday, May 29th. We have had larger than usual sized classes this year and last year.

In June we will bid a fond farewell to several of our beloved Teachers who are retiring: Patty George, Rozanne Stephenson, and Diane Toloski. On June 8th, at 7:00 P.M. in the spacious auditorium at Abraham Lincoln High School we will graduate 57 Eighth Graders from West Portal Lutheran School.
