etc.

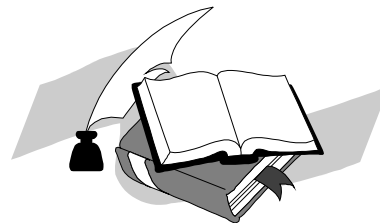
September 6th - Needle tatting - basics

Load about 5 feet on each shuttles.

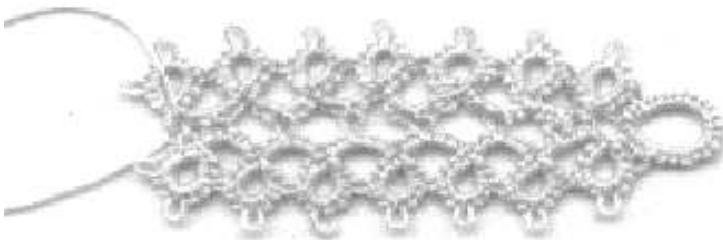
