Each year we call upon a group of members to improve their leadership skills and help build a supportive learning environment for our membership. It's that time of year to elect our club officers for the next Toastmaster season. Our officer elections will occur on May 13, 2003 during our regular club meeting.

Have you ever considered holding an officer post? Are you motivated by the possibility of improving our already great club? Listed below you will find brief descriptions of each position available. If you are interested in challenging yourself, improving your leadership skills and investing your abilities to improve our club, then please contact **Mike Rogers** (mikesspineshop@aol.com) or **Nuccio Geraci** (ngeraci@cfoexchange.com) for more information or to add your name to the ballot.

PRESIDENT: Serves as Chief Executive Officer responsible for the general supervision and operation of the club, presides at club meetings and works with other officers to develop and implement the Club Success Plan.

VP, EDUCATION: Directs the planning, organization, and implementation of Communication and Leadership, Speech Craft, and other educational programs. Recognizes member achievements, assigns mentors and manages the Member Progress Chart.

VP, MEMBERSHIP: Enrolls and inducts new members, manages the master membership list, and follows up with guests to answer questions. May also run a membership drive contest each year.

VP, MARKETING: Publicizes our club and events happening within our club.

TREASURER: Manages the club finances, collects dues, pays expenses and submits financial information to the club and Toastmasters headquarters.

Distinguished Club Program

What better way to help individuals achieve their Toastmaster goals than by providing incentive to the whole club? After all, who doesn't want to belong to a **Distinguished** club, or better yet, a **Select Distinguished** or even a **President's Distinguished** club?

Because giving speeches and interacting with other members, (receiving their evaluations and hearing their speeches) are the two primary means for us all to reach our goals, the Distinguished Club Program focuses on *Education* and *Membership*.

The program revolves around the Club Success Plan. The Plan contains 10 specific goals. They are:

- Two CTMs
- Two more CTMs
- One ATM May be Bronze, Silver or Gold
- Another ATM Again may be Bronze, Silver or Gold
- One CL, AL, or DTM
- One more CL, AL, or DTM
- Four new members
- Four more new members
- Minimum of four club officers trained during each of the two training periods
- One semiannual membership report and one officers list submitted on time

Clubs that meet at least five of these goals achieve the designation of Distinguished, while clubs that meet seven of the goals achieve Select Distinguished. Ultimately, **great** clubs like South Shore Soliloquy achieve **President's Distinguished!**

We are in the midst of a successful year and have already achieved 8 of the 10 goals. This makes the South Shore Soliloquy a "Select Distinguished" club. But there's still time before this Toastmaster year comes to a close in July. With just 3 goals to reach, we are striving to reach the President's Distinguished level again this year. Let's keep up the great work!

Speech Contests

Each year, in the Spring and Fall, Toastmasters International conducts the International Speaking contests beginning at the club level. The goal is to have speakers challenge and extend their presentation "comfort zone". The result is a contest of talented speakers delivering presentations in a new dimension. Just ask anyone who has competed in a speech contest before!

In March 2003, the South Shore Soliloquy conducted its club level International Speech and Tall Tales contests. The International Speech contest is designed to allow the speaker to select a subject of their choice and showcase their speech craft. Our club level winner was George Boerger, ATM-B, who delivered a thought-provoking speech asking, "Do your socks match your shoes"? While the speech had very little to do with socks and shoes, George's speech writing was clever, his delivery was direct and thought provoking and his message was poignant.

The Tall Tales contest is where a speaker presents a 2 to 3 minute speech about a subject of their choosing that is far-fetched and often times, fictional. The goal is to entertain the audience while spinning a yarn that showcases your speaking talents.

Our club level Tall Tales contest winner was Bob Bergman, CTM, who delivered a very funny tale of bringing "Pets to Work". Bob's enthusiasm, vocal variety and humor showcased his talents as an entertaining speaker who knows how to bring home a laugh.

Our club winners, George and Bob, advanced to the Area level contest held on March 26 in Falmouth. After an exciting competition of talented speakers, the South Shore Soliloquy's own, George Boerger and Bob Bergman, both captured first place in their respective contests.

The third level of the competition, the Division F contest, was held on April 6 in Cumberland, RI. Unfortunately George was unable to attend the Division contest but Bob Bergman represented the South Shore Soliloquy and valiantly competed against other accomplished speakers.

At the Division level contest you are sure to find many polished and professional speakers who have previously won their club and area level contests. As you can imagine, there are some entertaining presentations! While Bob did not reach first place in the Division level contest he can certainly be proud of his performance!
