# **Making The Cut**

It's common sense that hiring managers don't interview everyone who applies for an open position. But new research suggests the number of individuals called for an interview is smaller than you may think. According to a new survey from OfficeTeam, executives polled said, on average, they interview just six candidates for each job opening.

Therefore, as one of only a handful of candidates to secure an interview, you've crossed a major hurdle in the hiring process. The key then becomes presenting your skills and talent effectively and building rapport with the hiring manager to distinguish yourself from other applicants. Here are some tips to help you do so:

- Expect tough questions. No matter how prepared you are, it's likely the hiring manager will throw you a couple of curveballs by asking questions you didn't anticipate. In this situation, consider your answer before responding, ask for clarification if necessary and speak with confidence no matter how unsure you feel.
- Focus on the value you can add. Above all, the hiring manager wants to know what you can bring to the table. Discuss experiences and accomplishments that relate directly to the position so the interviewer understands that you can immediately contribute to the firm.
- **Be yourself**. It's to your advantage to present as honest and clear a picture of your abilities as possible to ensure the job is right for you. Don't pretend to be someone you're not or possess skills you don't.
- Follow up. The interview doesn't end once you leave the hiring manager's office. When you get home, send a note thanking the interviewer for his or her time and restating your interest in the position.
