

SLEEPING AREAS

Sleepover participants will sleep in one of our exciting exhibit halls. Sleeping areas are assigned by the Sleepover program staff and cannot be selected. Washrooms are readily accessible for changing. Please note that we do not have shower facilities and in true sleepover fashion all participants will bunk down to sleep on the floor.

Please note: Some sleeping areas are not carpeted.

SUPERVISION AND SECURITY

Group Leaders/Organizers are responsible for supervision. Security staff and Sleepover program staff remain in the building throughout the night. The Ontario Science Centre has special emergency procedures and protocols for overnight events. All Sleepover participants are trained in fire-drill procedures at the beginning of the night. The minimum supervision ratio is 1 adult, leader or supervisor to 8 children.

60 days or more prior to your confirmed Sleepover date: 90% refundable

28-59 days prior to your confirmed Sleepover date: 50% refundable

27 days or less from your confirmed Sleepover date: No Refund

This policy applies to individual as well as group cancellations and refunds. Refunds are made only after your Sleepover event date. except when the entire group cancels. Refund cheques are made payable only to the remitter (group or organizer) of the original payment. We reserve the right to cancel any Sleepover for which we have not registered a minimum number of participants.
