Hello Scouts & Parents,

I would like to welcome all the new scouts and parents to into our Troop. Troop 185 just celebrated 40 years as a Troop in Quakertown. I know some of you may have some questions regarding scouting and our program here at Troop 185. I would like to extend and invitation to our parent committee meeting on Sunday March 15th, 2009. This is a very important meeting for everyone. Prior to this meeting, we hope you will all get a chance to meet some of our Troop Committee and Scout Masters. Mike Houdek is our Committee Chairman. Each year new scouts and parents join scouting. You and your son will be given our Troop Scout Parent Guide. Within that guide, lists an array of specific Troop 185 information. Our program is based solely on volunteers. We all know the juggling of work and our children's evening activities can be a little crazy at times. My hope is that we plan together and with everyone giving to each other a hand now and again, our children will reap an amazing life teaching program. I must have at least two adults on every trip.

It is that time of year that new boys will be joining our Troop. Those of you who are coming from a pack or just joining for the first time should find the transition into our troop rather smooth. When a scout joins our Troop, he will be given a Boy Scout Handbook as a gift from our Troop. Within that Handbook, all the information on the scouting program is described. He will use that handbook on his entire scout journey to age 18 When he first joins Boy Scouts, he will be assigned a older experience Boy Scout (Troop Guide) to aide in the transition. He will complete a few simple requirements list in his book. He will be given his first Rank called "SCOUT". The following ranks in order will require a multitude of tasks and experiences; TENDERFOOT, SECOND CLASS, FIRST CLASS, STAR, LIFE and highest rank EAGLE. Some of those experiences come in a form of Merit Badges otherwise known as MB's. Rank advancement will require your son to complete MB's. These can be obtained in a group setting, summer camp or some cases by him self. Inaddition, he will need certain MB's to continue to his next rank. The rate of his advancement primarily is at his own pace. To reach the highest nationally recognized Boy Scout rank of "EAGLE", he must complete 12 specific and total minimum of 21 total MB's. Starting next week, we will begin the 2009 Troop Merit Badge Sessions for 10 weeks.
