## UFOs IN THE BIBLE?

### ARE UFOs DESCRIBED IN THE BIBLE?

For a number of years some authors have been writing about the presence of UFOs as if they are mentioned in the Bible. Men such as Sitchin, Schellhorn, and Brooks have been foremost in following this line of reason.

Schellhorn's book circa 1993, "Extraterrestrials In Biblical Prophecy" is a good example of this line of reasoning. It is interesting that These authors claim to believe in the Bible as God's Word. Each tries to document the existence of UFOs and ETs from the Bible. Quoting hundreds of texts, trying to prove UFOs and ETs are of heavenly origin and ordained by God from the beginning and given many assignments to carry on His work in the universe. Each tries to show how they have worked intimately with God in the creation of planet earth and how they directly had a hand in the genetic engineering of Adam and Eve.

Schellhorn's claims need to be looked at closely, for if they are true, the Bible is clearly contradicting itself, for the message these ETs bring is foreign to Scripture. Yet many are hailing his book as the last word and proof that authenticates the existence of UFOs and ETs from the Bible.

His book is a compilation of the thoughts and ideas of many writers, brought together to try and prove that Scripture does support this phenomena.

Schellhorn is well acquainted with the Bible and brings to light in the later chapters of the book endtime prophecies with some valid interpretations about what he feels is to come. He believes in the imminent return of Jesus Christ, and that the world as we know it is going to be destroyed. He readily admits that he may be in error on some points and does not claim his viewpoints are infallible. He appears to be a humble man with a good analytical mind, a good researcher, and a deep student of the Bible. This makes his book appear credible and believable. But herein lies the problem. The material he has compiled to support his beliefs

**DOES NOT AGREE WITH SCRIPTURE.** He repeatedly used methodology in interpreting that makes the Bible say what it clearly does not mean, and is in fact no proof at all.

The book repeatedly plays the semantics game to build a case for ETs and UFOs. Every mention of a supernatural encounter with angels, light, earthquake, clouds, eagles, even the creation of man, is seen as an encounter with, or a visit by extraterrestrial gods from outer space. In almost every instance when the Bible uses the term "angel," or refers to angels as coming in the form of men, he uses instead of angel, the word "extraterrestrial." An obvious reason for doing this, is of course to get the reader to think in terms of ETs.

He frequently refers to God or the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as "Master," and sometimes "Commander," terms commonly used to identify so-called leaders of ETs from the different planets. Ezekiel's vision of "wheels within wheels" flying about the heavens is interpreted as being a graphic description of UFOs. Moses and the burning bush is another example. When the Lord God came to Moses in the mountain of Sinai and passed before him with thunderings, and lightning, clouds and fire, Schellhorn interprets as a UFO contact sent by God.

Schellhorn's book of over 450 pages, tries to scientifically document his ideas, quoting from many other writers, all of whom bring archeological evidence from the same sources -- ancient Mesopotamian clay tablets and pictographs unearthed many years ago, and from other evidence gathered from around the world, the earliest of these being the Sumerian tablets and writings. Schellhorn states that in his writing of the book, he leaned heavily upon the findings of Sitchin whom we quoted above. The problem is that each of the many authors have drawn from each other and the common pool of ancient writings to build their case. Thus each mirrors the thinking of the other with added insights of their own.

This circular kind of thinking leads to the same thinking which proves nothing but the common bias held by all the writers and researcher. If the inspiration of ancient writings was from the wrong source, which we hope to prove, then their suppositions and ideas are based on totally false information and their arguments have no credibility.

The theories, postulates, hypotheses, speculations, and surmisings are circular in that these ideas emanate from one source, the ancient writings and pictographs. Believing these to be true historical records, the Bible accounts are misinterpreted and bent to fit the false records, and the individuals personal beliefs. Thus the Bible is interpreted to say what the author wants it to say in order to prove his point.

Unfortunately Schellhorn's book is a perfect example of this kind of circular reasoning. Not recognizing the inherent problems in this kind of thinking, many intelligent and knowledgeable people come to the same conclusions as the author. This is particularly dangerous when dealing with spiritual matters. Deception abounds in this atmosphere, and that is as the enemy would have it, for he definitely has a vested interest.

#### MAKING SCRIPTURE SAY WHAT YOU WANT IT TO SAY:

By reading into words in the Bible like "clouds," "light," etc., they "wrest the Scriptures to their own destruction" (2 Peter 3:16). Preposterous claims and allegations can be made about texts that have nothing to do with aliens and UFOs. But millions of unsuspecting readers, seeking for truth, are taken in by these claims and are deceived, and entrapped into believing this monstrous delusion as truth. This will have eternal consequences for them, for the stakes are extremely high -- eternal life or eternal death.

In the same vane, they leave a question in the reader's mind as to whether the "Elohim," God's name, which includes the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, actually created the solar system, or whether this was left to the space cosmonauts, thus making them creators. A theme carried out through the book in regard to planet earth and Adam and Eve. According to Schellhorn, they also were responsible for "biped man," the apelike man which preceded the genetic juggling of man's genes which created Adam and Eve. It is also suggested that Adam and Eve are "humanoid mutants," the offspring of some "demigods."

The planet earth is described along with the Garden of Eden as some sort of genetic experimental laboratory where the ETs from other planets experimented with altering genes, developing superior strains by trial and error. How different this is from the simple Biblical account that says God created everything.

Schellhorn discusses the "Nephilim" mentioned in Genesis 3 as sons of God, suggesting that they were a superior line of humanoids, who came from outer space, extraterrestrials from some distant planet. We would agree that they are extraterrestrials and created beings, but not ETs as envisioned today. They can be proved by the Bible to be the satanic angels cast out of heaven with Satan.

A great emphasis is placed on a runaway planet called Marduk, which is identified and described in ancient writings as larger than our planet. It supposedly visits our solar system every 3600 years, and when it does the force of gravity exerted by this large body on earth (they say) is responsible for the ice ages and the shift of the axis of the earth.

To use the Bible in this way, you can make it say whatever you want to support any opinion or bias. On the subject of UFOs and space aliens, Scripture has and is being violated and misused to support this lie and delusion.

Schellhorn's book is valuable, for it reflects well the current thinking about UFOs. But the problem with these ideas is that human interpretations and reasoning have taken the place of a simple "thus saith the Lord." As honest and objective as Schellhorn appears to be, his research is flawed in that he started with a bias and preconceived idea obtained from satanically inspired and manipulated ancient writers. Predictably his conclusions follow theirs.

#### THE SPIRITUAL CONNECTION:

Strong spiritual connections with witchcraft and satanic ritual can be found, and even ties with the apparitions of the virgin Mary which began in Fatima in 1917, and which are proliferating rapidly around the world, keeping pace with UFO sightings. We are not dealing with things of the natural world, but rather the supernatural in which there are only two sides: GOOD and EVIL -- God's and Satan's.

This makes it possible to determine from the evidence given by each side what is truth. Comparing what the Bible says with what the extraterrestrials (ETs) say, it can easily be seen that they are not on the side of good.

#### MUST AGREE WITH SCRIPTURE:

We have shown how this phenomena does not compare with Scripture. Let us dig deeper and look at more evidence. For example: Statements supporting the EVOLVING of man into a higher state of being, or that the E.T.'s were once like we are, but now have evolved into something better cannot be proved from the Bible.

The Bible says that man was created in the image of God, the Creator and did not evolve from anything. Because of sin, man has evolved alright, but downward! His lifespan went from almost 1,000 years before the flood to 70 years after. The Bible tells us that those who believe and follow Jesus will be instantly recreated in His likeness at His second coming.

Any message about reincarnation or talk of an afterlife and of there not being such a thing as death and sin is a dead giveaway. The first lie told by Satan to Eve was that if

they partook of the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil "you shall not surely die." (Gen. 3:4) He has been pushing this theme ever since that time. Yet, God says "the soul that sinneth it shall die." (Eze. 18:20) This lie is the chief cornerstone of Satan's belief system which is being pushed by him everywhere in the world with great intensity as the battle heats up between the opposing sides. The theme of life after death is pushed by the media almost everywhere one turns. The vast majority of the Christian world accepts the idea that at death, there is a soul or spirit which goes to heaven or hell, yet the Scripture does not teach this at all; in fact just the opposite.

Another example of lies preached by apparitions are messages of peace and unity. This message is heard around the world. It is the heart and core of the New Age Movement, and the New World Order, BUT IS NOT BASED UPON SCRIPTURE. Any movement moving toward peace and unity and the setting up of an earthly kingdom to bring in the "New Age of Aquarius," by the year 2,000, is not a movement from above but from below. The Bible is very clear that when the world is crying peace and safety, then sudden destruction will come upon them.

THE ONLY BASIS WE HAVE FOR DETERMINING who and what is behind the UFO, ET phenomenon, as well as the many other delusions of the enemy IS THE WORD OF GOD. Without the foundation of truth, the seeker for truth will remain in the death grip of ignorance. As we continue to examine material gathered about UFOs from various sources, we can see a common thread of ideas continually recurring in UFO contacts with earthlings. This thread of ideas put forth by the beings from UFOs includes:

1. A message of PEACE AND UNITY. They come not to harm, but to warn their brothers to come into agreement.
2. We are EVOLVING into a better phase or life form. They believe that man evolved from lower forms of life.
3. There is NO DEATH, only spirals of life in new circumstances. The mind of man is ever evolving to a higher state of being, even after death - often referred to as "another dimension," a "higher plane."
4. You have POWER WITHIN YOU TO SAVE YOURSELF. "You are god!" (We have no power in and of ourselves. Only Christ's power can change and cleanse us from sin. We are saved by the blood of the Lamb of God.)
5. The master (Satan disguised as Christ) is going to soon return in a saucer to set up his kingdom.
