On Sunday, May 4, along with Dr. Dreyfus, I had the honor of marching in the procession of Faculty and Alumni, at the Service of Ordination and Investiture of new rabbis and cantors. Each year the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion is given the courtesy of holding these exercises at Temple Emanu-El of New York, which adds its own majesty to the splendor of the occasion. Preschool News

The end of the school year marks the end of a cycle in preschool life. Everyone is busy making plans for the summer and thinking ahead to the start of the next school year in September. It is certainly hard to believe that the school year is nearly over, but as I reflect on all that has happened since we opened our doors in September, our experiences have been plenty. When I think about all of the wonderful things that went on at the Preschool this year, my thoughts turn to our new extended day program and our collaboration with the Brooklyn Museum of Art. Both of these programs were enormously successful and have strengthened and enriched our preschool. However, sometimes our most valuable lessons are sent to us in the guise of adversity. Needless to say I am referring to the flood. Although it was inconvenient and unpleasant and certainly not what we asked for, like much of the adversity we face in life, it afforded us the opportunity for growth. Some of this growth was very concrete, vis a vie the extensive renovation the fourth floor underwent. Our space is now much more comfortable and beautiful. The renovation enabled us to better adapt the space to our needs. On a less concrete level, dealing with a crisis always serves as a lesson to us all. We are always teaching our children, through the examples we set, and the lives that we live. The behavior we model for our children is the greatest lesson we teach them. Our ability to keep the school running, and to continue to provide a warm, nurturing and stimulating environment provided our children provided our children with a very tangible model for dealing with adversity. It sent a message to our children that sometimes bad things happen in life, but we have the strength to deal with them, and succeed. In a year fraught with hardships all over the globe, this was certainly a valuable lesson.

We have taken those lessons and tucked them away to call on at some time, hopefully far in the future. For now, we are planning for a wonderful new year at Union Temple Preschool. Starting in September, the preschool will have a new threes class. We will also be adding two additional extended days per week. Extended days will now be available Mondays through Thursdays. Christine Bardach our threes teacher will continue to teach the extended day program twice a week. Pam Apple our fours teacher will be teaching the other two days. Jackie Sarrantino will assist both Christine and Pam. We will continue to offer creative movement once a week, with Nicole Wolcott, whose classes engage the spirit and bodies of all of our children. We will also be offering music on a regular basis, with, Jonathan Bayer. Jonathan visited us for Chanukah and Passover this past school year. His classes combine religious and secular music in a very lively, entertaining and interactive class. We will continue to offer our collaborative program with the Brooklyn Museum of Art, to our four year olds, with the addition of one new curriculum unit.

Our summer camp will run for seven weeks this summer, beginning on June 16th and ending on August 1st. Laurie Stengel will be joining us once again as head teacher. She will be assisted by Julianne Coates, who worked here several years ago as a Counselor in Training (CIT). We are thrilled that Julie will be back with us. David Shaffer and Natalie Roth will both be returning as CITs this summer. We still have some openings, so if you are interested please contact me at the preschool (718) 623-1322.

Officer's Report

For me as president, the last year was one of both accomplishment and great frustration. There are many positive events that we, as a congregation can be proud of. This past year all our temple functions were both supported and well attended.

We were faced with a tremendous problem when the pool leaked and the water did extensive damage throughout the temple. Yet with the positive attitude and approach of both Marty Shaffer and Jean -Pierre Halioua, it may well have been a "blessing in disguise." Through their year long effort, which still continues, temple facilities were cleaned, painted and refurbished. It is difficult to single out and praise the efforts of all the contributing congregants but I cannot let this opportunity pass without thanking Marty and Jean Pierre for the tremendous service to Union Temple this past year

Our religious school and our preschool had a successful year. With the space enhancement that took place on the fourth floor we will be able to accommodate a substantial increase in the preschool enrollment next year.

In addition to our active Sisterhood, we can now be proud of our temple Brotherhood. It has been revitalized and become an integral part of the Temple. The rabbi with the choir and ritual committee are constantly striving to improve services. This past Saturday's adult B'nei and B'not mitzvah service was the culmination of a great deal of time and effort on the part of our rabbi and the congregants who participated. This beautiful and meaningful service proved, that the hard work and study of those concerned was worth their effort.

For the coming year we have hired a full time cantor. with a most magnificent voice. We look forward to services filled with even more beautiful liturgical music.

The various committees have met and are planning a full schedule of activities for next year. Union Temple is alive and well and we anticipate the coming year to be exciting and successful. I was hoping to report that the sale of the parking lot had been completed, but regretfully I must say this is not the case. Negotiations went on throughout the year and finally the parties involved agreed there were no issues of substance remaining. We all were working toward a closing date of Friday, May 2. On May 1 I received a call from our lawyer stating the health club and their partners still had issues to be discussed. Although they did not pertain to us, the closing could not be on Friday. We in turn replied that there was to be no more negotiations or talking on our part. In order to come to contract the partners would have to bring a check for the down payment. As of this date we have not heard from them.

There is continued interest in the lot and we resumed talks with other interested parties. It's not a question of if the parking lot will be sold, it is just when. The importance of this sale for Union Temple's future requires us to stay the course until we can reach our goal. In the interim until a sale can be finalized a bridge loan may be necessary to meet ongoing expenses. We learned a great deal from past experiences and are confident the sale lot will be accomplished in the very near future.

I want to thank Rabbi Goodman, the officers, trustees and congregants of Union Temple for their support during what has been a most unusual and trying Temple year. Thank you.

A PROGRESSIVE VIEW FROM ISRAEL

with

RABBI MICHAEL BOYDEN

Rabbi of Kehilat Yonatan, a new Reform congregation in Hod Hasharon; Director of the National Rabbinic Court for the Israel Council of Progressive Rabbis

Rabbi Michael Boyden was born in London, England, and is a graduate in Hebrew Literature from London University. He was ordained by the Leo Baeck College in London and served as Rabbi of Cheshire Reform Congregation near Manchester before making aliyah with his wife and two children in 1985.



In his leadership roles with the Israel Council of Progressive Rabbis (MARAM) and its National Rabbinic Court, Rabbi Boyden represented the Reform Movement on the Ne'e-man Commission established by the Israeli government to resolve the conversion crisis, and subsequently on the Executive set up by the Jewish Agency to establish a Joint Institute to prepare candidates for conversion in cooperation with the Orthodox and Conservative streams.

Rabbi Boyden was the founding rabbi of the Ra'anana Reform Congregation in Israel, for whom he spearheaded a successful 10-year campaign to be awarded public land by the city hall, and raise the funds to erect a synagogue and community center there. His current congregation, Kehilat Yonatan, is a new Reform congregation located in Hod Hasharon, 10 miles northeast of Tel Aviv.

He recently formulated a public statement entitled, "Where We Stand On Israel," which was endorsed by over 130 Reform rabbis worldwide and was subsequently adopted by the Board of the Central Conference of American Rabbis.
