Faculty grantees present theses, dissertation

To provide a venue for bringing together educational planners, researchers, policymakers, and practitioners in higher education to discuss the results of graduate researches and to generate ideas on how to further research endeavors, the CHED-UPLB ZRC held a research colloquium on the CHED Thesis and Dissertation Grantees at the DA-BAR Network Building, UP Los Baños, March 2, 2007.

Four grantees were invited to present significant findings of their researches. All of them were UPLB faculty members. They were: Vermont P. Dia (Production and Characterization of Virgin Coconut Oil), Dennis V. Cantre (Furosine (C-N-2 furoylmethyl-L-lysine) as Index of Lethality in Thermally Processed Foods), Fermin P. Resurreccion, Jr. (Development, Fabrication, and Testing of a Low-Cost Device for Determining Process Schedule in Thermal Processing of Food), Vida Q. Carandang (Impact of Rainfall Acidity on the Germination and Early Seedling Growth of Three Forest Tree Species in Two Soils in Mt. Makiling, Philippines).

Dia, Cantre, and Resurreccion took up Master of Science in Food Science while Carandang graduated Doctor of Philosophy in Forestry.

Selected reactors were also invited to provide insights on the merit of the studies and give comments to improve the final output of the researches. They were: Dr. Fabian M. Dayrit (Dean, College of Science and Engineering, Ateneo de Manila University), Dr. Benjamin T. Molano (Senior Science Research Specialist, Food and Nutrition Research Institute, DOST), Dr. Aida B. Lapis (Supervising Science Research Specialist, Ecosystems Research and Development Bureau, DENR).

Center hones GIA projects' staff

To enhance the statistical know-how and accounting capabilities of the eight potential CHED Grants-in-Aid (GIA) grantees, the CHED-UPLB ZRC held a training-workshop on Basic Statistical Models for Research and Research Budgeting at the DA-BAR Network Building, UP Los Baños, April 17-18, 2007.

Seven project staff attended the statistical training (first day) which was handled by Prof. Roselle V. Collado, Director of the Institute of Statistics in UPLB.

The training consisted of the following sub-topics: Introduction, Basic Concepts and Definitions, Statistical Inference, Types of Samples and Probability Sampling Methods, Basic Concepts in Statistical Inference, Methods of Data Collection, Forms of Interview, Sample Size Determination, Questionnaire Construction, Analysis and Interpretation of Statistical Reports, Sta-

tistical Methods, Statistical Diagrams Statistical Tables .

Meanwhile, three accountants and two project proponents as representatives attended the research budgeting training (second day). The UPLB accounting staff led by Chief Accountant Ms. Joan C. Mendoza oriented the participants on UPLB's basic accounting rules and procedures on trust funds to which the GIA projects belong.

Financial Analyst Ms. Linda C. Mendoza of the UPLB-Office of the Vice-Chancellor for Research and Extension

explained and demonstrated the preparation of the Advice of Suballotment—a paper requirement that states the breakdown of major expenses.

Together with two other researches from Ateneo de Naga University and Camarines Sur State Agricultural College, the papers shall tentatively start on June 2007 with a total budget of PhP 2,558,663.78 as being requested from CHED.

To ensure the efficient conduct of the researches, the Center introduces the concept of *mentors*—the ones who shall assist the project proponents in all aspects of their researches like consultants but at the same time as monitors of the ZRC on the development of the studies assigned to them.

After the call, nine research proposals from eight member HEIs were received by the Center. The six proposals which passed the initial screening were then invited for presentation and evaluation before the GIA Pool of Technical Experts at the DA-BAR Network Building, UP Los Baños on November 13, 2006.

Dr. Carolina Santillana, the director of the Institute of Community Education of the College of Public Affairs-UP Los Baños joins the pool which initially consisted of Dr. Enrico P. Supangco, ZRC Program Director, and Dr. Salcedo L. Eduardo, a professor at the College of Veterinary Medicine-UP Los Baños.

Dr. Miriam E. Pascua, MMSU president also attended the presentation of research outputs.

Supangco keynotes CHED-ZRC LSU regional seminar-workshop

Dr. Enrico P. Supangco, ZRC Program Director, was invited as keynote speaker by Dr. Angela Almendras-Ferraren, ZRC Director at Leyte State University on "The Role of HEIs in Agricultural Technology Generation and Extension," during the regional seminar-workshop entitled, "Agricultural Technologies in Eastern Visayas: The Roles of Institutions and Impacts on Its Users", held at the ISRDS AV Room, LSU, Baybay, Leyte, April 24-25, 2007.

In CHED's effort to develop the academic qualifications of tertiary faculty to masters and doctorate degree levels in order to improve the Philippine higher education, it developed the Faculty Development Program—a major component of the six-year Higher Education Development Project (HEDF).

The project grants scholarships for thesis/non-thesis master's and doctorate programs to be undertaken on campus/via distance learning on a full/part-time basis where scholars are expected to continue teaching in their respective institutions while on part-time study and after completion of the degree.

CHED-UPLB ZRC disseminates, recommends, and endorses faculty to the Faculty Development Program. Currently, it has assisted two faculties who are pursuing master's degrees in UP Los Baños. These are Ms. Kathlyn Bartolome Cruz, MS in Veterinary Medicine and Ms. Jewel A. Capunitan, MS in Chemical Engineering.

Bartolome is a faculty of Cagayan State University in Tuguegarao. At present, she is working on her thesis entitled, "Detection of Anthelmic resistance for Benzimidazoles in Selected Goat (Capra hircus Linn.) Farms in Cagayan Valley by Larval Development Assay and Allele-Specific Polymerase Reaction." On the other hand, Capunitan is an Instructor 5 at the College of Engineering and Agro-industrial Technology in UP Los Baños. As of writing, the Center has been processing her Certification of Employment as a requirement for the thesis grant.
