Site 1.

1. Since this site has to do with animals I think that the teachers could use it for science.
2. This site is geared towards kindergarten to 1st grade children.

4. On the site there are many games to teach the children about the different types of animals: mammals, reptiles & amphibians, insects & arachnids, birds and fish. The children can click on a picture representing each of the types of animals and then click on a game. There are about ten games for each different type of animal. The game asks kids all types of questions about that particular group of animals. The site is very colorful and easy to use.

Site 2.

1. This site is all about the weather so it would be useful for science.
2. The site has simple songs that sound entertaining for kindergarten children.

4. The site has ten links for songs about the weather. Each link has an audio option as well as the lyrics for each song. The background looks like a cloudy sky. This is a simple website with links to places where you can purchase discs for their own use.

Site 3.

1. The site uses money so it would be good for math.

4. The main site gives you options between 3 and 6 pieces of money as well as what denomination of money from a penny to twenty dollar bills. After the child selects the level they want they are given a pictorial representation of some money and a two boxes to fill in for dollars and cents. They then click to submit their answer and are told if they are correct or if they are wrong they are given a chance to enter another amount, get a hint or just get the answer.

Site 4.

1. This is a site about the Pomo Indians of California, so it is a history site.
2. The site is for 5th graders.

4. At first this site seems a little dry and boring. There are a lot of words and no interactive links. However I feel that the way the information on the site is written is very easy to understand, something that a fifth grader could easily use on a project about this tribe. The information is divided into six very manageable topics with interesting information in each of the subjects. The site is also decorated with traditional Native American art.

Site 6.

1. The site quizzes you on synonyms, which is a language arts skill.
2. Synonyms are a standard for 4th grade.

4. This site gives you sixteen cards with a single word on them. You have to find the synonym for a particular card and click on both of them. If you get the right answer those cards are turned over, if not nothing happens. You can alter the amount of cards and thus the difficulty of the game.

Site 7.

1. This site tests suffix and prefixes, so it is language arts.
2. This is something that 3rd graders need to know.

4. The site gives you a root word and then you have to pick out of three choices what suffix or prefix works with that word. After you chose the correct prefix or suffix you are asked if it makes sense in a sentence, if not you have to click next and if so then you click a makes sense button. If you click the makes sense button incorrectly then you are told why it does not make sense and you are asked to try again.

Site 8.

1. The site makes kids determine if a sentence is grammatically correct which is a language arts skill.
2. The site is geared towards 4th grade standards.

4. The site gives you a sequence of 30 sentences and asked you to click on yes or no depending on if the sentence is grammatically correct. After each sentence you are told if you were right. After you do all thirty of the sentences you are told how many you got right. The site isn't very exciting but it does test the children well.

Site 9.

1. Odd and even have to do with testing the Math skills.
2. This is something that should be known in 2nd grade.

4. The first page gives you a choice to be tested on numbers up to 10, or 30 or 100. The next page gives you a big circle labeled even number and another one labeled odd numbers. There are also ten numbers in boxes on the bottom. The directions tell you to sort the numbers according to odd and even then you can click on a button that says check. If you get all the answers correct a page comes up telling you so, and if not a page comes up telling you that the numbers were sorted incorrectly and you have a chance to go back and fix your mistakes.

Site 10.

1. This is a math website.
2. The site is for 3rd graders.

4. The site teaches and explains perimeters and how to measure them. There is an ant that walks you step by step through finding the perimeters of different objects and then asks you to complete the problem. If you get it wrong then a box pops up that tells you to try it again. If you get it correct then a box pops up that tells you that you got it correct. There are arrows on the bottom of the page that let you skip around to different objects and go back to previous objects.
