



### THE WRONG WAY TO CHOOSE A BIKE

# THE WRONG WAY TO CHOOSE A BIKE....is to have the salesman tell

you what bike to buy! The majority of sales people want to sell a bike and the



Key questions to ask yourself are: How am I going to use the bike (touring or just tooling around)? How often am I going to use the bike? It's typical that the first couple years of owning a bike you're going to ride it every where and anywhere! If there's only a *little* snow you think you can still get out there and ride...if it's only 13 degrees you ride the bike...if it's raining you still ride the bike...you just can't keep off it!!.

Be grateful to have a salesman ask these questions: You should think it through as much as you can so the salesman can help you through the process. You don't initially have to jump on a big bike. It takes time to get confidence in your riding.

We know life styles change frequently and personal interests change, too. Starting out on a small bike can be a good way to learn what your riding interests are so you can then move on to (if you even need to!) a different bike. The key here is to make sure the sales person takes a genuine interest in your purchase. Having the right fit and right size bike the first time is awesome.

Have fun getting the proper 'fit' for your new motorcycle!

Making sure both feet are securely on the ground (with the proper riding gear); the weight of the motorcycle and if the handlebars are a comfortable reach (although changing handlebars and foot control re-positioning can provide significant posture improvement); and of course THE COLOR!! That's the most fun of all! Contact your favorite professional to get your 'fitment' started ©.




