History Corner: A section that provides historical information on the 1st Nebraska. The purpose of this section will to provide specific information for members on the history of our unit.


Authenticity Corner: A section for the Authenticity committee to address topics of their choosing related to authenticity and improving our impression.

New Associations

Over the past few years there has been a noticeable reduction in the number of reenactors attending local events and the number of our members attending events has seen a significant reduction. We've had events where the total combined infantry has been less than 30 rifles. This really limits our ability to put on a realistic event that the public and participants would enjoy. The past couple of years we have been working with other re-enactment units to address this problem. As a result the Muddy River Battalion and Midwest Civil War Re-enactors Association were created. I am including some additional information on each one of these organizations to provide you with some history about why each was formed and the goal of each of these organizations.

Muddy River Battalion

The Muddy River Battalion was formed primarily to provide units in the Northwest Missouri, Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota areas an opportunity to work together as a battalion at local, regional and national The Muddy River Battalion was events. founded by Jim Crofutt of the 7th & 30th Missouri Volunteers and includes following units: 1st Nebraska Volunteer Infantry, 3rd Iowa Infantry Volunteers, 13th U.S. Regulars (Company D), Consolidated Company 7th and 30th Missouri Volunteers, 23rd Illinois Infantry Volunteers, the 25th Missouri (Company A) "Saint Joseph Rifles and an independent Company the Veteran Reserve Corps. The latter is currently being developed. Since our formation the battalion has participated in events at Fortesque, Missouri; Brownville, Nebraska; Olathe, Kansas: Pawnee City, Nebraska and Westport, Missouri. This has provided our unit with the opportunity to function, on the field, in a battalion organization which has provided some of the newer members of the unit with a new experience and some of the

older (more experienced) folks a chance to refresh their knowledge on battalion maneuvers. At Westport Missouri in 2008 the battalion fell in with the First Federal The First Federal Division was Division. really pleased with how the battalion performed on the field and has offered the battalion membership in the First Federal Division. This will provide benefits for the battalion when attending large regional and national events. As a result of our involvement with the Muddy River Battalion we have dropped our membership with the Frontier Brigade. The Muddy River Battalion provides us with a better opportunity to work with units that can support our events and we can reciprocate by supporting their events.


<u>Midwest Civil War Re-enactors</u> <u>Association</u>

The Midwest Civil War Re-enactors Association was formed in 2007 as a result of discussions between Mike Carr from the 10th Iowa and myself. Mike and I began the association with the idea that we needed units in the Nebraska/Iowa area to better coordinate our activities so that we could reduce the number of conflicting events, increase participation at events and improve the overall quality and safety of events. organization currently consists the following units: 1st Nebraska, 1st New York Light Artillery, Battery B a/k/a Pettit's Battery, 165th New York Zouave, 10th Iowa Volunteer Infantry, Fremont Pathfinders (Infantry and Cav), K Battery, 4th U.S. Artillery and the 1st Illinois Artillery. organization has developed a set of standards related to safety on the field and in the camps. We continue to work together on coordinating events and supporting the events the members of the organization have voted on as Max Effort Events. The association differs from the Muddy River Battalion in that the association has no command structure on the It operates from an organizational aspect to work towards improving the quality of events and increasing the attendance at events.

Our involvement with Muddy River Battalion and the Midwest Civil War Re-enactors Association has impacted our yearly schedule and those events that are identified as our Regimental or "Max Effort" events. The idea is to support both of these organizations by attending the events they deem important or they sponsor. In addition, they work towards supporting our events. As we move forward this should help to increase number of reenactors participating in events and improve the quality of the events.

We are in the process of summarizing the results of the surveys that were returned and will have results out in the next month or so. The purpose of the survey was to obtain your ideas on what we can do to improve meetings, camp impression and membership activities.


2009 Event Schedule

At the March Business Meeting the unit voted on the event schedule for the 2009 season. The schedule is attached at the end of this newsletter. We need to get some idea as to our numbers for the scheduled events so if you could review the list and let Rex or I know as to which events you anticipate being able to support it would be appreciated. A couple comments on the events:

The St. Joseph, Pawnee City and Fortesque events are Muddy River Battalion events so we will be operating in battalion formations at these events.

Powder Rations are being provided for the Carson Iowa event. Our unit will receive a pound of powder for every rifle that we put on the field. This helps the unit in reducing the expenditures for powder.

Planning is underway for the Pawnee City event. We are expecting more confederate infantry this year so this event could be larger than in the past. TJ is working with the Pawnee City Historical Society on getting more ground for camping and for the battle. This is our sponsored event for the year and more information will be provided in future newsletters.
