UNO Orienteering Camping Weekend

September 9 & 10, 2006, Pawtuckaway State Park, Raymond, NH

The Orienteering

Map: 6 color 1:10,000 Produced 1992 for the World Cup Courses, Updated in 2001 and 2005 String, White, Yellow, Orange, Green, Red, Blue and the famous Saturday night “Vampire-O”, Canoe-O plus; after the Vampire-O a technically tough night-O courtesy of JJ Cote. Check in and starts for the normal camping weekend events are 10am to 1pm on Saturday and 9am to noon on Sunday. Master maps will be used and the “O” cost will be the standard UNO local meet fees. (UNO Members - \$5 adult, \$2 juniors; Non-members - \$6 adult, \$3 juniors; \$2 for an extra map). Registration will be under the shelter at the Group Pavilion (follow signs) **Note: Park closes at 8pm Friday evening and reopens at 9am Saturday morning.**

The Directions

Take NH 101 East (towards the seacoast) from Manchester. Take exit 5 and turn right on NH 107 north. Turn left on NH 27 and then immediately right on NH 156. Go 1.3 miles and turn left on Mountain Rd. Go 2 miles to park entrance/ camping registration. Follow “O” signs to meet registration/ start.

The Camping

We will be using the Neal’s Cove area, Friday and Saturday nights. This is the area that we used for the past several years. Rates are \$27 per family per night. Up to 2 adults in addition to the 2 covered by the family rate can stay on a site for \$14 per night each. There are a total of 22 tent only campsites available and it is convenient to the group picnic shelter/meet HQ. Lex and Pete Bundschuh are coordinating reservations for these sites and will try to fit as many people there as possible. These are first-come, first-served. Contact Lex and Pete (number listed below) if you are interested in having them hold a tent site for you. Once these sites at Neal’s Cove are full, you will have to make individual campsite reservations directly with central reservations. If you have made arrangements with the Bundschuh’s to stay at Neal’s Cove, you still need to stop at the Park Headquarters’ for a parking pass. The Bundschuh’s will be collecting the camping fee for the Neal’s Cove sites at the Group Camping Pavilion. If you have a camper or pop-up, you will also need to call **central reservations** directly to be assigned a appropriate site nearby.

(reserve early, the park can still be a busy place in early September) Sorry, no pets allowed in the park.

The Dinner

UNO Camping Weekend has a Saturday Night Pot Luck tradition.
