General Rules

A Scout is to be Trusted:

- Obey the Rules of the games
- Obey the law of the Land, e.g. no smoking, drinking etc., (see over)

A Scout is Loyal:

- Don't be late
- Wear the agreed uniform for each activity (see over)

A Scout is friendly and considerate:

• Be considerate to the general public when on Scout activities

A Scout belongs to the Word-wide family of Scouts:

- Don't bully
- No punching, biting, spitting, kicking or fighting

A Scout has courage in all difficulties:

A Scout makes good use of time and is careful of possessions and property:

- Respect equipment (see over)
- Sew all badges onto uniform within a week of getting them

A Scout has self-respect and respect for others:

- Respect Leaders, PLs and all other Scouts
- Be quiet when the whistle is blown
- Pay attention during announcements
- No bad language (see over)
- No sweets or gum during Meetings

1st Cookham Scout Troop TROOP RULES

Troop Rules concerning Swearing, Drinking, Smoking, Equipment and the Environment.

- \Rightarrow **NO DRINKING (ALCOHOL)**
- \Rightarrow NO SMOKING
- \Rightarrow NO SWEARING
- ⇒ CARE OF EQUIPMENT AND THE ENVIRONMENT

DRINKING:

(at Camps/Events)

- Appear before the PLC immediately
- Phone parents to collect from Camp immediately. If this is not possible, remove from all activities and work with Quartermaster until he can leave.

(back in Cookham)

• Will appear before the PLC to discuss the issue - perhaps temporary suspension from Troop - dependant on the level of the misdemeanour.

SMOKING:

• Same as for Drinking

(Leaders)

• Only to smoke in own (Leader) areas and well away from all Scouts.

SWEARING:

- To be avoided wherever possible but depends upon circumstances.
- Appear before the PLC depending upon circumstances and for 'repeat offenders'

EQUIPMENT / ENVIRONMENT:

(at Camps/Events)

Appear before the PLC to discuss issue - then according to severity;

- Apology to whole Troop at flag break / flag down
- Community Service (Working with Quartermaster for Camp and Leaders)
- No tuck
- Remove from activities

(at Troop Meetings)

- Remove from games / activities
- Community Service (working as Quartermaster for Troop / Leaders) i.e. washing up, cleaning equipment etc.,
- Work for Group to Pay for replacement or repair as appropriate
